

ABSTRACT FOR PROPOSITION NO. 1 APPLICABLE TO A PORTION OF
ELECTION DISTRICT NO. 41

Form of Proposition:

Resolution No. 1191-2014, “Making Certain Findings and Determination and an Order in Relation to the Establishment of Suffolk County Sewer District No. 26 – Melville Huntington”

Resolution No. 1191-2014 proposes the establishment of a County sewer district known as “Suffolk County Sewer District No. 26 – Melville Huntington”, describes the boundaries of said district, makes findings regarding the facilities to be acquired in connection with the establishment of the district and authorizes the Suffolk County Department of Public Works and the Administrative Head of the proposed district to carry out the establishment of Suffolk County Sewer District No. 26 – Melville Huntington.

Shall Resolution No. 1194-2014 be approved?

Enactment of this proposed Resolution would authorize the establishment of a sewer district, to be formally known as “Suffolk County Sewer District No. 26 – Melville Huntington”, to be comprised of an area fully described in Resolution 1191-2014, and as further set forth in the maps, plans, and estimate of cost attached to Resolution 1191-2014.

Establishment of the proposed sewer district will not require the issuance of bonds, notes, certificates or other evidences of indebtedness to the County. The Suffolk County Legislature has determined, as required by Article 5-A of the New York State County Law, that: the facilities to be acquired are satisfactory, sufficient, adequate, and appropriate; all property and all property owners within the boundaries of the proposed sewer district are benefited; all property and property owners that are benefited are within the boundaries of the proposed sewer district; and that the establishment of the district and the acquisition of the facilities are in the public interest.

Enactment of this proposed Resolution would authorize the Suffolk County Department of Public Works and the Commissioner of the Department of the Public Works, as the Administrative Head of the sewer district, to carry out the establishment of the sewer district. This shall include the acquisition of the facilities as described within the aforementioned maps, plans and estimate of cost attached to Resolution 1191-2014.

Upon a petition received by the Clerk of the Suffolk County Legislature objecting to the establishment of the sewer district, through the adoption of Resolution 537-2015 and in accordance with New York State County Law Section 101, the Suffolk County Legislature has required that this proposition be submitted to the resident electors and in the form recited above.

If this referendum is approved by the majority of the electors who are resident within the proposed sewer district, this resolution would take effect upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State.
