Dear Ms. Russo:

In accordance with Resolution 918-2011 (attached), the County recently implemented a formal Request for Expressions of Interest (RFEI) for the design, restoration, operation, management, occupancy, and maintenance of residential or business facilities at Elwood School House and Black Duck Lodge. We are in receipt of two proposals. We are requesting your assistance in appointing Maryann Spencer as a member of the RFEI Evaluation Committee to determine if it is in the County's best interests to proceed with a formal Request for Proposal (RFP) and the parameters of what that RFP should include. Committee members will be required to attend all of the meetings and oral presentations, if applicable.

The RFEI Evaluation Committee will consist of:

1. A Budget Analyst from the County Executive's Budget Office.
2. The Chairperson of the Parks Legislative Sub-Committee or his/her designee.
3. A licensed Engineer or Architect from the Department of Public Works.
4. A representative from the Suffolk County Parks Board of Trustees.
5. An administrative staff member from the Department of Parks.
6. A member of the Suffolk County Historical Trust.

Copies of the proposals will be distributed to Ms. Spencer and the Evaluation Committee will meet at an agreed-upon date and time at our offices in West Sayville to determine how we should proceed. In accordance with IR No 1577-2010 Adopting a Procurement Policy Manual for Consultant Services, all members of the evaluation committee will be asked to complete the attached "No Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statement."

**RESOLUTION NO. 918 -2011, ESTABLISHING A HISTORIC  
STRUCTURE RESTORATION PILOT PROGRAM AND  
DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION  
AND CONSERVATION TO ISSUE A REQUEST FOR  
PROPOSALS**

**WHEREAS**, the County of Suffolk holds thousands of acres of parkland property in the public trust; and

**WHEREAS**, historic structures exist on many County parkland parcels; and

**WHEREAS**, many of these historic buildings are in disrepair and need significant restoration, without which they may be lost; and

**WHEREAS**, Suffolk County recognizes the educational, cultural and historic importance of maintaining these buildings for current and future generations; and

**WHEREAS**, the economic downturn has significantly impacted the County, requiring officials to think "outside the box" to find ways to meet the County's needs; and

**WHEREAS**, to meet the goal of preserving historic buildings while recognizing the County's budgetary constraints, a pilot program should be created under the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation ("Department") to seek responsible private parties willing to invest in the restoration of these structures and occupy them following restoration; and

**WHEREAS**, under this program the Department will issue a Request for Proposals ("RFP") or Request for Expressions of Interest ("RFEI") to gauge interest in the restoration and occupation as a licensee of the following five historic structures on County parkland: the Elwood Schoolhouse, the Commerdinger House, the Robinson Duck Farm, the Black Duck Lodge, and the Robert Cushman Murphy Davis House; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department will take into account the licensee's investment in the restoration of the structure, among other factors, when determining a reasonable occupancy fee; and

**WHEREAS**, licensees under this program will be required to allow appropriate public access and use of the restored historic structures and such use and access shall be a required element in the RFPs or RFEIs let pursuant to this program; now, therefore be it

**1st RESOLVED**, that the Historic Structure Revitalization Pilot Program is hereby established to allow private entities to restore historic structures and associated landscape on County parkland and occupy said structures for the benefit of the County and its residents; and be it further

**2nd RESOLVED**, that the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation and the Department of Public Works are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to jointly prepare and issue an RFP or RFEI for the restoration and occupancy of the following five structures and their associated landscape: the Elwood Schoolhouse, the Commerdinger House, the Robinson

Duck Farm, the Black Duck Lodge, and the Robert Cushman Murphy Davis House; and be it further

**3rd** **RESOLVED**, that the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation shall evaluate each of the five structures and associated landscape participating in the program to determine if the structure would be best utilized for residential or non-residential purposes and incorporate such use into the RFP or RFEI; and be it further

**4th** **RESOLVED**, that the structures and associated landscape to be renovated for non-residential purposes shall allow the public, municipalities, community groups and non-profit organizations access to the structure and allow stewardship responsibilities to be established or continue; and be it further

**5th** **RESOLVED**, that the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation and the Department of Public Works are further authorized to develop all criteria necessary in the preparation of the RFP to ensure that the respondent chosen will restore the subject historic structure and its associated landscape properly and will allow appropriate public access to the structure and associated landscape; and be it further

**6th** **RESOLVED**, that the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation will provide a written report to the Legislature within ninety days of the issuance of the RFP/RFEI setting forth a summary of the responses to the RFP/RFEI; and be it further

**7th** **RESOLVED**, that a preference shall be made in the review and awarding of licenses for applicant veterans who can prove honorable service on active duty in the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast Guard during a period of war via a Form DD-214 and other supporting documentation or an applicant congressionally chartered veterans organization, provided the applicant meet all other requirements set forth in the RFP/RFEI; and be it further

**8th** **RESOLVED**, that any license or agreement entered into under this program will be subject to the approval of the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality/Historic Trust ("CEQ"), the Division of Historic Services of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation, and this Legislature; and be it further

**9th** **RESOLVED**, that the Pilot Program established herein shall be reviewed every five years by CEQ to ensure that the restoration and occupation of these historic sites are continuing in furtherance of the Program's goals; and be it further


**10th** **RESOLVED**, that any revenue generated from this program shall be used solely for the restoration and maintenance of historic sites under the control of the Division of Historic Services of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation; and be it further

**11th** **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on

Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.



**WHEREAS**, Local Law No. 24-2007, "A Charter Law Extending and Accelerating the Suffolk County ¼% Drinking Water Protection Program for Environmental Protection," Section C12-2(A)(1) authorized the use of 31.10 percent of sales and compensating tax proceeds generated each year for environmental protection, as determined by duly enacted Resolutions of the County of Suffolk; and

**WHEREAS**, adequate funding is provided for, pursuant to Section C12-2(A)(1) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER, from 31.10 percent of the sales and compensating tax proceeds, for the acquisition of such land; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 1002-2007, authorized planning steps for the acquisition of said property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Environmental Trust Review Board has reviewed the appraisals and the report of the Internal Appraisal Review Board and has approved the purchase price and authorized the Director of Real Estate and/or her designee to negotiate the acquisition; and

**WHEREAS**, based upon the Environmental Trust Review Board approved value, an offer to acquire the subject property was made to and accepted by the owner of said property; and

**WHEREAS**, contracts to acquire said property were prepared by the office of the County Attorney, executed by the owner of the subject property and the Director of Real Estate and/or her designee and approved as to legality by the Office of the County Attorney; now, therefore, be it

**1<sup>st</sup> RESOLVED**, that the County of Suffolk hereby approves the acquisition of the subject property set forth below under the New Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program, effective as of December 1, 2007, Open Space component, for a total purchase price of subject to a final survey; and hereby authorizes additional expenses, which shall include, but not be limited to, the cost of surveys, appraisals, environmental audits, title reports and insurance, and tax adjustments:



 as determined by a reasonable planning and hydrological study, 1.6 ± acres - Hamlet of East Patchogue, Town of Brookhaven



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Please be advised that we have reviewed the Phase I Environmental Site Assessment for the above referenced property transmitted by your office. The assessment prepared by Advanced Cleanup Technologies, Inc. is in compliance with the 11/25/08 Environmental Site Assessment Criteria required by the Suffolk County Department of Economic Development and Planning and Division of Real Estate. Based on the information within the assessment concerning the recent site survey, the review of existing EPA, NYSDEC and Suffolk County Department of Health Services' records in relation to toxic and hazardous waste sites, as well as the historical review of the site and its surrounding areas, it appears that the property in question does not contain recognized environmental conditions.

It is however recommended that the following issues be addressed prior to acquisition:

- 1) The Phase I Environmental Site Assessment noted that landscaping wastes were observed in piles at several locations throughout the property. In addition a rusted refrigerator, metal debris and stockpiled soil (located in the southwestern portion of the property) were also observed on the property. All landscaping waste piles, the rusted refrigerator, metal debris and the stockpiled soil should be removed and properly disposed of prior to acquisition. Preferably these issues should be resolved prior to the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality's review of this proposed property acquisition.






