**LEGISLATOR STEVE STERN ENCOURAGES RESIDENTS TO SIGN UP FOR
HEAP BENEFITS**

Program Opens November 19, 2012

HUNTINGTON, NY –Suffolk County Legislator Steve Stern (D-Huntington) 16th LD is encouraging eligible residents to sign-up for Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) benefits. Many Suffolk County residents will face difficulties in keeping their homes warm this winter. “I encourage residents to apply for HEAP benefits as soon as possible,” Legislator Stern said. “This program provides needed assistance so that our neighbors do not have to choose between heating their homes and putting food on the table.” Eligibility guidelines are listed below.
