Coram man convicted of third dwi in 11 years

A Coram man faces up to four years in prison following his conviction this afternoon, his third since 1999, on drunken driving charges.

After four days of deliberations the jury convicted Kenneth Bowrosen, as charged on all counts; driving while intoxicated as an E felony, two counts of aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle in the first degree as an E felony and operating a motor vehicle without a seatbelt.

Bowrosen, 35, of Circle Point South, Coram, was arrested by Suffolk County police on July 1, 2010 for driving drunk on Pine Road in Coram.

He served seven years in an upstate correctional facility following his conviction in 1999 for manslaughter in the second degree, vehicular manslaughter in the second degree, assault in the second degree, vehicular assault in the second degree, assault in the third degree and driving while intoxicated.

His most recent conviction for driving while intoxicated was in 2009 when he was sentenced to one year of incarceration.
