**Fake federal agent to be arraigned on indictment tomorrow**

David Bradley, the Port Jefferson Station man arrested June 11 for impersonating a federal agent, will be arraigned on a grand jury indictment tomorrow (Wednesday June 20) in Suffolk County court in Riverhead.

Bradley, 39, wearing a bulletproof vest, a badge and what appeared to be a gun in a holster, stopped a teenager driving in Port Jefferson Station around noon on June 10 using the emergency lights on his SUV.

Police said Bradley identified himself as an Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agent and handcuffed the 19 year old before taking him to his house on Grove Street. After detaining the victim for a short time, Bradley removed the handcuffs and returned the teen to his car at the scene of the traffic stop on Woodhull Avenue.

Bradley is also charged in connection with an incident in Port Jefferson Station on May 4 when he approached police at a crime scene and offered assistance, identifying himself as a federal agent.

Judge James F.X. Doyle (second floor of the courthouse) will unseal Bradley's indictment. Suffolk County Assistant District Attorney Stacy Skorupa will prosecute the case.
