Sentencing Friday for repeat drunk driver

A Coram man, convicted last month of his third dwi in 11 years, faces up to four years in prison at his sentencing tomorrow (Friday, February 25) in Suffolk County court in Riverhead.

After four days of deliberations, a jury convicted Kenneth Bowrosen, 35, of driving while intoxicated as an E felony, two counts of aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle in the first degree as an E felony and operating a motor vehicle without a seatbelt.

The conviction was Bowrosen's third drunken driving conviction since 1999.

His most recent arrest was on July 1, 2010 for driving drunk on Pine Road in Coram.

He served seven years in an upstate correctional facility following his 1999 conviction for manslaughter in the second degree, vehicular manslaughter in the second degree, assault in the second degree, vehicular assault in the second degree, assault in the third degree and driving while intoxicated.
