## **New charges for Miller Place man charged in fatal hit and run**

A Miller Place man faces new charges in a six-count indictment unsealed in Central Islip today, Suffolk County District Attorney Thomas Spota said.

Appearing before State Supreme Court Justice Fernando Camacho, Christopher Campbell, 37, pleaded not guilty to two charges of vehicular manslaughter, leaving the scene of a fatal crash, driving while intoxicated and two counts of aggravated unlicensed driving in the second degree.

Campbell was the alleged driver of a commercial, box-type truck that struck and killed Tracy Mangino, 40, as she walked on North Country Road, near Block Island Drive in Miller Place, on the night of October 18, 2014.

At the time of the hit and run, Campbell was driving without a license having surrendered it when he was arrested for DWI in Port Jefferson Village early on the morning of June 30, 2012.

After sideswiping a car on Main Street in Port Jefferson, Campbell, according to witnesses, attempted to leave the crash scene on foot but was captured and arrested by a Suffolk police officer. Campbell refused to submit to a chemical test.

Campbell is free on \$100,000 bond.
