Wyandanch man convicted of sex crimes against two girls


After four hours of deliberations a Suffolk County jury has convicted a 31 year old Wyandanch man of committing sex crimes against two young girls, District Attorney Thomas Spota said.

For crimes committed against the first victim, Juan Carlos Henriquez Ramos of Parkway Boulevard was found guilty of two counts of rape in the first degree, two counts of sexual abuse in the first degree, one count of course of sexual conduct against a child in the first degree and one count of course of sexual conduct against a child in the second degree. According to the indictment, the rapes and sexual abuse occurred when the victim was 11 years old in June and July of 2011. The course of sexual conduct charges resulted from Ramos having intercourse with the victim in September of 2011 and again in January of 2013.

For the second victim, described in the indictment as less than 13 years old in 2012, the jury convicted Ramos of one count of sexual abuse in the first degree for "sexual contact".

Ramos was acquitted of two counts of sexual abuse in the first degree for alleged crimes against the second female in 2012.

District Attorney Spota said following the verdict, Ramos was certified as a sex offender and remanded to the county jail for sentencing on November 2 when he will face up to 50 years in state prison.
