LEGISLATOR CALARCO SWORN IN FOR SECOND TERM

Hauppauge, LI— Suffolk County Legislator Rob Calarco took the oath of office for his second term as the Legislator for the 7th Legislative District at last week's Organizational Meeting of the Legislature.

Calarco said, "I am humbled to have been re-elected to serve another term as Legislator by the voters of my District.
