



1 SMITH POINT COUNTY PARK 

Shirley 631-852-1315
The County's largest ocean front beach (over 5 miles) offers outer beach camping for self-contained campers and trailers in designated areas and depending on beach conditions (No tents). access the outer beach from the East Booth Check Station. There is lifeguard protected swimming and a full service food concession (in season), at the main pavilion bathing area.

Directions: William Floyd Parkway south to beach. Outer Beach access at East Booth.

2 CUPSOGUE BEACH COUNTY PARK 

Westhampton 631-852-8111
Cupsogue Beach provides limited outer beach camping on the bay side of Moriches Inlet, for self-contained trailers and campers (No tents). Cupsogue also offers ample opportunities for surfcasting. There is lifeguard protected swimming and a full service food concession (in season), at the main pavilion bathing area.

Directions: From the village of Westhampton, go south on Jessup Lane and cross the bridge. Turn right on Dune Road. Take it to the end to the park entrance.

3 CHARLES F. ALTENKIRCH COUNTY PARK

Hampton Bays 631-854-4949
Located on the west side of the Shinnecock Inlet, this park offers ample fishing and general beach use opportunities for the adventurous. Limited parking for County residents is available adjacent to the inlet. Beach goers must walk to the beach. Limited off-road vehicle access is permitted between September 15 through March 15 with a valid recreational vehicle use permit.

Directions: From the Village of Westhampton, go south on Jessup Lane and cross the bridge. Turn left on Dune Road to the park.

4 SHINNECOCK EAST COUNTY PARK

Southampton 631-852-8899
Located on the east side of the Shinnecock Inlet, Shinnecock East provides limited self-contained outer beach camping on both the ocean and Peconic Bay for campers (no tents). A small parking lot is available for green key card holders without a valid recreational vehicle use permit. This park is a favorite spot for surfcasting on Shinnecock Bay, Inlet and the Atlantic Shore.

Directions: Sunrise Highway east to Southampton College, turn right on Tuckahoe Road, left on Montauk Highway, right on Halsey Neck Lane to Dune Road. West on Dune Road to the park.

5 CEDAR POINT COUNTY PARK 

East Hampton 631-852-7620
Gardiners Bay and Northwest Harbor provide a beautiful backdrop along the outer beach. Home of the historic Cedar Point Lighthouse and 607 acres of hiking trails,, row boat rentals and woodland camping this is a true hidden treasure of a park.

Directions: Montauk Highway east to Stephen Hands Path in East Hampton. Turn north and continue to Old North West Road. Bear left and continue to Alewife Brook Road. Turn left, park entrance will be on your right.

6 NORTH WEST HARBOR COUNTY PARK 

East Hampton 631-852-7620 (Cedar Point)
Located along North West Harbor Marina, Northwest Harbor outer beach access area, although small, provides outstanding views and pristine fishing waters.

7 MONTAUK COUNTY PARK

Montauk 631-852-7879
With over 3 miles of beach on Block Island Sound, this Park offers outer beach day tripping and camping for self-contained trailers in designated camping areas. While small boats and personal water craft may be trailered and launched at this park, certain restrictions may apply. All launching and retrieval must be as directed by park personnel.

Directions: Two and a half miles east of Montauk Village. Turn left on East Lake Drive. Follow to end, entrance to beach on right.

8 ORIENT COUNTY PARK

Orient 631-852-3232 (Indian Island)
Located on the eastern tip of the north fork of Long Island, this small waterfront Park known for its pristine views and ample fishing. Outer Beach and fisherman can park along the point and walk onto the beach area.

Directions: Take Route 25 East to the end. The Orient Point Outer Beach area access is to the left of the Orient Point Ferry parking area.



Many beaches on Long Island are excellent habitat for shorebird nesting. Among these birds, is the piping plover. The piping plover is listed as threatened and therefore is protected under the Endangered Species laws. Known nesting areas marked with signs and fencing but adults and chicks feed along the water's edge. Please stay away from the birds and the protected areas. Depending on nest locations, Outer Beach access may be limited or closed.
