Minutes:

Minutes for the December 14, 2016 CEQ minutes were reviewed and discussed.

A motion was made by Mr. Kaufman to approve December 14, 2016 minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Carpenter. Motion carried.

Correspondence:

It was noted that the CEQ received an informational mailing on the Forge River Watershed Sewer Project. The mailing provided an update on the project and noted that the project is currently in the permitting and environmental review phase. CEQ staff noted that the New York State Governor's Office of Storm Recovery is the SEQRA Lead Agency for this project and that the CEQ was included in the SEQRA Coordinated Review process.

CEQ staff also noted that as requested at the December 2016 CEQ meeting they contacted the New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) for additional information on the issue of the replacement salt dome project being located in an archeological sensitive zone. Staff noted that in response to the inquiry they received an email from Tim Lloyd who handles SHPO archeological reviews for Long Island which stated that due to the disturbed nature of the site there was not a concern with the project impacting archeological resources.

A presentation was given by Boris Rukovets, Special Projects Supervisor, with the Suffolk County Department of Public Works. The project involves the design and construction of the necessary rehabilitation and improvements to the wastewater treatment plant and for repairing portions of the Suffolk County Sewer District # 14 – Parkland’s collection system sewer lines and pumping stations.

A motion was made by Mr. Kaufman to recommend classification of the proposed project as a Type II Action. The motion was seconded by Mr. Swanson. Motion carried.

- B. Proposed Design and Construction of In-Kind Replacement and Rehabilitation Improvements to Suffolk County Sewer District #21 – SUNY, CP8121, Town of Brookhaven

A presentation was given by Boris Rukovets, Special Projects Supervisor, with the Suffolk County Department of Public Works. The project involves the design and construction of the necessary improvements to the wastewater treatment plant.

During the CEQ review a question was brought up regarding TMDL requirements and their potential impact to the operations at the Suffolk County Sewer District #21. Boris Rukovets, noted that he has not been involved in recent TMDL discussions. The CEQ requested that CEQ staff reach out to DPW and see if they can provide some additional information regarding this question. CEQ staff noted that they will reach out to Suffolk County Department of Public Works to see if there is additional information that can be provided to the CEQ.

A motion was made by Mr. Kaufman to recommend classification of the proposed project as a Type II Action. The motion was seconded by Mr. Swanson. Motion carried.

Attached is a short EAF for the referenced sewer district. The majority of facilities were constructed in the mid 1970's through 1980 and although modifications and upgrades have been performed in the past, there is the need to be proactive with respect to this equipment and building infrastructure. All work would be confined to replacement in-kind of the facilities on the WWTP site. The adopted capital budget includes \$1.0 million to address these problems. The infrastructure includes the aeration blowers, auxiliary mechanical and electrical equipment and repair to buildings and treatment tanks.

Attached is a short EAF for the referenced sewer district. The sewer district has six remote pumping stations each with a varying length of force main and approximately 30 miles of sanitary sewers. The majority of facilities were constructed in the mid 1970's through 1980 and although modifications and upgrades have been performed in the past, there is the need to be proactive with respect to this sewage conveyance infrastructure. Not all locations have been identified with respect to the need for improvement, but many of the areas have sewer pipe which is subject to corrosion and failure. All work would be confined to replacement in-kind of the facilities including within rights-of-way or easements. The adopted capital budget includes \$0.75 million to address these over the next three years. The infrastructure includes the pumping stations, force mains, various areas of gravity sewers including their manholes, and other appurtenances.



Improvements to SD # 14 – Parkland


Suffolk County Sewer District No. 14 (S.C.S.D. 14) – Parkland is located in the Hamlet of Holbrook, in the northeastern portion of the Town of Islip, New York. This capital project is to provide the design and construction of the necessary rehabilitation and improvements to the wastewater treatment plant. Parkland WWTP serves the properties within the district boundaries that are single family homes and condominiums as well as contractees to the district. Contractees are those property owners who are outside the district boundary but have a contract with the Suffolk County Sewer Agency to have their waste treated at the County WWTP.

The WWTP was constructed in the mid-1970's and has undergone improvements in the past. It is necessary to continue the rehabilitation and improvements to extend the useful life and to insure the regulated permit limits are met. Improvements include replacement of three aeration blowers, the heart of the treatment process, along with auxiliary equipment. Rehabilitation of buildings, tanks, piping and mechanical-electrical components will be addressed. All work is in-kind replacement and rehabilitation.
