Minutes for the May 17, 2017 CEQ minutes were reviewed and discussed.

A motion was made by Mr. Kaufman to approve the May 17, 2017 minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Carpenter. Mr. Swanson abstained. Motion carried.

- Housing Program:

Mr. Martin noted that there are currently three vacancies at the Robert Cushman Murphy County Park. Mr. Martin discussed that Suffolk County Parks is in the process of doing repairs and upgrades and is working towards the goal of having the vacancies rented this summer. It was noted that Suffolk County Parks already has prospective tenants for the units. Mr. Martin also informed the CEQ that after the upgrades are completed market appraisals are planned to be done through the Suffolk County Division of Real Estate to update the rental rates.

**Recommended Unlisted Actions:**

- A. Proposed IR 1509 -2017 – A Local Law Establishing a Policy to Reserve County Sewer Capacity, All County-owned Sewer Districts

Josh Slaughter, Chief Legislative Aide to Legislator Kate Browning, gave the Council a presentation regarding the proposed action. The proposed action would prevent new construction developments which are located outside the boundaries of an existing Suffolk County Sewer District and produce more than 300,000 gallons of sewage flow per day from connecting to an existing County sewer facility. After an extended discussion regarding the proposed action the CEQ decided that additional SEQRA information was needed before the CEQ could make a SEQRA recommendation.

Mr. Kaufman made a motion to table the SEQRA Review of IR 1509-2017 for additional SEQRA information to be submitted to the CEQ. Ms. Growney seconded the motion. Motion carries.

- B. Proposed North Fork Preserve Drainage Improvements, Sound Shore Road, Hamlet of Northville, Town of Riverhead

Nick Gibbons, Principal Environmental Analyst, Suffolk County Department of Parks, Paul McMahon, Principal Civil Engineer, Suffolk County Department of Public Works, and Alex Gimpelman, Senior Civil Engineer, Suffolk County Department of Public Works made a presentation to the Council on the proposed action. This project, which will take place on the North Fork Preserve Property, is intended to retain stormwater runoff onsite and reduce the amount of stormwater that is currently running off the northerly portion of the property to adjacent roads, private properties and the Long Island Sound.

A motion was made by Mr. Kaufman to recommend classification of the proposed project as an Unlisted Action with a Negative Declaration. The motion also included the CEQ recommendation that additional land on Suffolk County Tax Map Number 0600-007.00-03.00-041.001 may be utilized to expand Retention Basin # 3 by up to 50% of what is indicated in the June 6, 2017 dated EAF without being considered a substantive project change that would require additional SEQRA review if said expansion is determined to be warranted to accommodate additional stormwater flow. The motion was seconded by Ms. Growney. Motion carried.

- C. Proposed Acquisition of Land Under the New Enhanced Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program 2014 Referendum – Land Purchases for Open Space Preservation – Beaverdam Creek Watershed Addition – Calderone Property, Town of Brookhaven

Ms. Laretta Fischer, Chief Environmental Analyst, with the Suffolk County Department of Economic Development and Planning gave a presentation regarding the acquisition of an approximately 0.28 acre parcel, identified by Suffolk County Tax Map Number 0200-961.00-03.00-084.000, by Suffolk County under the New Enhanced Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program 2014 Referendum – Land Purchases for Open Space Preservation. The acquired land would be dedicated to the Suffolk County Parks Department for passive recreational use.

A motion was made by Ms. Growney to recommend classification of the proposed project as an Unlisted Action with a Negative Declaration. The motion was seconded by Mr. De Rubeis. Motion carried.

### **Narrative for Short Form EAF relating to IR 1509**

Protecting our drinking water aquifers and existing sewer capacity for low lying, water font communities is critical to long-term sustainability on Long Island. This legislation seeks to ensure that large scale developments build their own, individual sewage treatment plants.

The negative impacts of outfall sewer plants that do not discharge directly back into the watershed they draw from are increasingly becoming a problem for our aquifer. This is having a serious impact on our existing water supply and will only get worse if large developments are hooked up to these existing sewage treatment plants. Nassau County is already considering tapping into aquifers that were once thought untouchable because of the depletion of resources as a result of draw down. Nassau County is even seeking to begin taking water from Suffolk County's aquifer, further jeopardizing our resources.

In addition, older plants have been upgraded in the last decade to allow for vulnerable low lying communities to hook up through the expansion of sewer districts. Many of these upgrades were paid for with federal storm recovery dollars in order to address the impacts of sea level rise and the sustainability of these communities that still use outdated cesspools. By allowing large scale new developments to connect to these existing sewer districts, we are jeopardizing our ability to connect existing low lying communities that desperately need it. Adding additional nitrogen loading to our waterways while limiting our ability to reduce outdated cesspools is bad public policy.

**RESOLUTION NO. -2017, ADOPTING LOCAL LAW  
NO. -2017, A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING A POLICY TO  
RESERVE COUNTY SEWER CAPACITY**

**WHEREAS**, there was duly presented and introduced to this County Legislature at a meeting held on June 6, 2017, a proposed local law entitled, "**A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING A POLICY TO RESERVE COUNTY SEWER CAPACITY**"; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, that said local law be enacted in form as follows:

**LOCAL LAW NO. -2017, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK**

**A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING A POLICY TO RESERVE  
COUNTY SEWER CAPACITY**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF  
SUFFOLK**, as follows:

**Section 1. Legislative Intent.**

This Legislature hereby finds and determines that nitrogen seeping from tens of thousands of cesspools and septic systems is endangering the quality of ground and surface waters in Suffolk County.

This Legislature further finds that it is generally accepted by environmental experts that sewerage of the County's low lying coastal areas must be a central part of the County's strategy to combat nitrogen pollution.

This Legislature further finds that the County of Suffolk currently operates twenty-three sewer districts and allows businesses and developments located outside the boundaries of these districts to apply for connection to these sewer facilities.

This Legislature finds that several large mixed use developments, which are now in the planning stages, wish to connect to an existing County sewer district.

This Legislature also determines that the capacity of the County's sewer facilities is finite so it is vital for applications for sewer connections be weighed carefully to ensure that approved projects do not preclude the future sewerage of communities located adjacent to the County's streams, rivers, inlets and bays.

This Legislature also finds that sufficient capacity must be reserved in the County's existing sewer districts, particularly the Southwest Sewer District, to accommodate the future sewerage of critical communities.

This Legislature also finds that it may be advantageous to require large development projects to build their own state of the art sewage treatment plants as the treated water could be returned to the ground to replenish the County's aquifers.

This Legislature concludes that large development projects which produce enormous amounts of waste water should not be permitted to connect to the County's sewer district facilities.

Therefore, the purpose of this law is to bar the connection of mega developments lying outside the boundaries of the County's sewer districts to connect to any existing County sewer facility.

**Section 2. Amendments.**

Chapter 740 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE is hereby amended as follows:

**CHAPTER 740.  
SEWERS**

**ARTICLE VIII.  
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

\* \* \* \*

**§ 740-45. Connection by premises outside district.**

\* \* \* \*

- (4) Whether there is adequate capacity within the affected sewer district to absorb the outside connection but in no event shall an application that would reserve more than 300,000 gallons of sewage flow per day, be approved.

\* \* \* \*

F. No contract between the Administrator and an applicant from outside the geographical boundaries of a district, which reserves more than 300,000 gallons of sewage flow per day, may be approved or entered into.

**Section 3. Applicability.**

This law shall apply to any application for a sewer connection that is presented to the Suffolk County Sewer Agency, and any connection agreement that presents to the Suffolk County Sewer Agency and the Suffolk County Legislature for final approval on or after the effective date of this law.

**Section 4. Severability.**

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

**Section 5. SEQRA Determination.**

This Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21), and/or (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. The Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this law.

**Section 6. Effective Date.**

This law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.







FRESHWATER WETLANDS AS

**WHEREAS**, Local Law No. 31-2014, a Charter Law Amending the ¼% Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program (DWPP) for Enhanced Water Quality Protection, Wastewater Infrastructure and General Fund Property Tax Relief for Suffolk County, created the 2014 Enhanced Suffolk County Water Quality Protection Program, codified in Suffolk County Charter Article XIIA; and

**WHEREAS**, in November of 2014, two-thirds of Suffolk County voters approved Proposition No. 5-2014, enacting the provisions of Resolution No. 579-2014. Local Law No. 31-2014, “A Charter Law Amending the ¼% Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program (DWPP) for Enhanced Water Quality Protection, Wastewater Infrastructure and General Property Fund Tax Relief for Suffolk County.” This Proposition recognized the essential nature of the Drinking Water Protection Program to the well-being of the County’s drinking water supply and required \$29.4 million in serial bonds be issued through the Capital Program for water quality protection program projects; and

**WHEREAS**, THE 2016 Adopted Capital Budget contains three water quality protection 2014 Referendum capital projects totaling \$29.4 million; CP 8732 for land purchases (\$20.0 million), CP 8733 for water quality projects (\$4.7 million), CP 8734 for sewer improvement projects (\$4.7 million); and

**WHEREAS**, this capital project provides \$20 million in serial bond funding for the acquisition by the County, by fee, lease or easement, of interests in land associated with the Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program; and


