- A. Proposed Acquisition of Land for Open Space Preservation purposes known as the Forge River Watershed Addition – Mennuti Property, Town of Brookhaven

The project involves the acquisition of approximately 4.3 acres, consisting of two parcels identified by Suffolk County Tax Map Number 0200-713.00-03.00-002.001 and 0200-713.00-03.00-002.003, by Suffolk County under the Suffolk County Supplemental Environmental Project for Land Acquisition and the New Enhanced Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program 2014 Referendum.

This acquisition is for the dedication of land to the Suffolk County Parks Department in order to assure it remains in open space for passive recreational use.

Mr. DeRubeis made a motion to recommend classification of the proposed project as an Unlisted Action with a Negative Declaration. Ms. Growney seconded the motion. Motion carries.

B. Proposed Design and Construction of a Community Park Known as Roe Park on Park Avenue in Blue Point, Town of Brookhaven

This project is proposed to be located on an approximately 2 acre site that was formerly known as the Blue Point Laundry site and is now owned by Suffolk County. Under an agreement with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Suffolk County completed an environmental remediation to remove the hazardous materials that was detected on site. With the onsite remediation work complete, the proposed project proposes to create a neighborhood park which is then intended to be transferred to the Town of Brookhaven to manage and maintain. The proposed project includes the construction of basketball courts, multi-use courts, shade structures, a running/skating path, a handicap accessible playground and a small parking lot. The project also proposes to re-establish a natural waterway for Purgatory Creek and create additional freshwater wetland habitat for local flora and fauna on the eastern portion of the property.

After an extended discussion the CEQ believed that it was important that a sidewalk be continued adjacent to the proposed park on the south side of Park Avenue. The CEQ also noted that due to the area's low elevation that it is important that proper drainage be maintained both on the subject property and on the existing County owned parkland to the north. In addition, the CEQ believed it was important that the project sponsor also investigate the possibility of using permeable pavement for the proposed parking lot and also investigate the possibility of aligning the parking lot with Brown Avenue. The CEQ felt the above discussion items were important and should be included in the CEQ resolution.

Mr. DeRubeis made a motion to recommend classification of the proposed project as an Unlisted Action with a Negative Declaration. The motion included that Suffolk County: will work to insure that sediment from Park Avenue does not impede proper drainage in the wetland system located on the proposed Roe Park property and directly to the north on the existing Suffolk County park property; will work with the Town of Brookhaven to establish a continuous sidewalk adjacent to the proposed Roe Park on the south side of Park Avenue; and will consider the feasibility of using permeable surface for the proposed parking area and also aligning the parking area with Browne Avenue. Hon. Hahn seconded the motion. Motion carries.

RESOLUTION NO. - 2017 AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF LAND UNDER THE SUFFOLK COUNTY SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECT FOR LAND ACQUISITION (CP 8735.210) AND UNDER THE NEW ENHANCED SUFFOLK COUNTY DRINKING WATER PROTECTION PROGRAM 2014 REFERENDUM - LAND PURCHASES FOR OPEN SPACE PRESERVATION (CP8732.210) FOR THE MENNUTI PROPERTY (TOWN OF BROOKHAVEN - SCTM#S 0200-713.00-03.00 002.001 AND 0200-713.00-03.00-002.003)

WHEREAS, Suffolk County has agreed to Consent Judgement) "Consent Judgement") with the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") concerning underground storage tanks and universal waste; and

WHEREAS, this Consent Judgement was authorized via Suffolk County Resolution No. 1183-2013; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1101-2015 appropriated the funds for this acquisition, subject to further resolution of the County Legislature to approve the specific land purchase and a corresponding bond resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Consent Judgement stipulates the County of Suffolk agreed to pay a \$2,000,000 penalty; and

WHEREAS, the monetary part of the penalty (\$500,000) was authorized via Resolution No. 1196-2013, leaving a remaining balance of \$1,500,000; and

WHEREAS, per the Agreement, the \$1,500,000 shall be expended upon a Supplemental Environmental Project ("SEP") involving land acquisition which is environmentally beneficial to Suffolk County residents as it will benefit and protect the ground, drinking and surface waters of Suffolk County; and

WHEREAS, the deadline for the acquisition is February 2018. "This project was undertaken in connection with the settlement of an enforcement action, United States vs County of Suffolk taken on behalf of the United States Environmental Protection Agency under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act."

WHEREAS, this capital project provides \$20 million in serial bond funding for the acquisition by the County, by fee, lease or easement, of interests in land associated with the Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program; and

WHEREAS, Resolution Nos. 185-2016 and 877-2005 authorized planning steps and Procedural Motion No. 18-2016 authorized the acquisition of said property; and





Robert Calarco, Suffolk County Legislator, District #7, the Council advises the Suffolk County Legislature and County Executive, in CEQ Resolution No. 43-2017, a copy of which is attached, that the proposed project be considered an Unlisted Action under SEQRA that will not have significant adverse impacts on the environment.

If the Legislature concurs with the Council on Environmental Quality's recommendation that the project will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment, the Presiding Officer should cause to be brought before the Legislature for a vote, a resolution determining that the proposed action is an Unlisted Action pursuant to SEQRA that will not have significant adverse impacts on the environment (negative declaration). However, if the Legislature has further environmental concerns regarding this project and needs additional information, the Presiding Officer should remand the case back to the initiating unit for the necessary changes to the project and EAF or submit a resolution authorizing the initiating unit to prepare a draft environmental impact statement (positive declaration).

WHEREAS, at its September 20, 2017 meeting, the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) reviewed the EAF and associated information submitted by the Suffolk County Legislator Robert Calarco's Office; and

WHEREAS, a presentation regarding the project was given at the meeting by Hon. Robert Calarco, Suffolk County Legislator, District #7; and

WHEREAS, this project is proposed to be located on an approximately 2 acre site that was formerly the Blue Point Laundry site and is now owned by Suffolk County; and

WHEREAS, under an agreement with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Suffolk County completed an environmental remediation to remove the hazardous materials that was detected on site; and

WHEREAS, with the onsite remediation complete, the proposed project proposes to create a neighborhood park which is then intended to be transferred to the Town of Brookhaven to manage and maintain; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project includes the construction of basketball courts, multi-use courts, shade structures, a running/skating path, a handicap accessible playground and a small parking lot; and

WHEREAS, the project also proposes to re-establish a natural waterway for Purgatory Creek and create additional freshwater wetland habitat for local flora and fauna on the eastern portion of the property, now therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that based on the information received and presented, a quorum of the CEQ hereby recommends to the Suffolk County Legislature and County Executive that the proposed activity be classified as an Unlisted Action under the provisions of Title 6 NYCRR Part 617 and Chapter 450 of the Suffolk County Code; and, be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that based on the information received, a quorum of the CEQ recommends to the Suffolk County Legislature and County Executive, pursuant to Title 6 NYCRR Part 617 and Chapter 450 of the Suffolk County Code, that the proposed project will not have significant adverse impacts on the environment for the following reasons:

1. The proposed action will not exceed any of the criteria in 6 N.Y.C.R.R. § 617.7, which sets forth thresholds for determining significant adverse impacts on the environment, as demonstrated in the Environmental Assessment Form;
2. The proposal does not significantly threaten any unique or highly valuable environmental or cultural resources as identified in or regulated by the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York or the Suffolk County Charter and Code;

3. All necessary permits/approvals will be obtained from all applicable State, County, Town regulatory agencies prior to the commencement of project construction;
4. Suffolk County will work to insure that sediment from Park Avenue does not impede proper drainage in the wetland system located on the proposed Roe Park property and directly to the north on the existing Suffolk County park property;
5. Suffolk County will work with the Town of Brookhaven to establish a continuous sidewalk adjacent to the proposed Roe Park on the south side of Park Avenue;
6. Suffolk County will consider the feasibility of using permeable surface for the proposed parking area and also aligning the parking area with Browne Avenue;

3rd RESOLVED, that it is the recommendation of the Council that the Legislature and County Executive adopt a SEQRA determination of non-significance (negative declaration).
