Mr. William Bowman with Land Use Ecological Services, Inc. gave a presentation regarding the Central Pine Barrens Commission Ecological Services Restoration for NYSDEC Eastport Conservation Area/Suffolk County Pine Meadows County Park Grasslands project.

It was noted that as the anticipated Lead Agency for this project, the New York State Central Pine Barrens Commission conducted a SEQRA Coordinated Review with the two Involved Agencies: Suffolk County and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. It was also noted that the New York State Central Pine Barrens Land Use Plan states that the Pine Barrens Commission shall seek SEQRA Lead Agency status for any development project located within the Core of the Central Pine Barrens. In addition to the SEQRA coordination, it was noted that the Central Pine Barrens Commission will closely coordinate project activities with both Suffolk County and NYSDEC throughout the duration of the project.

Project Review: Recommended Unlisted Actions:

A. Proposed Implementation of a Suffolk County Regional Bike Share Pilot Program

Jonathan Keyes, Director of Downtown & TOD, Suffolk County Department of Economic Development and Planning gave a presentation on the implementation of a Suffolk County Regional Bike Share Pilot Program. The pilot bike share program is proposed to include approximately 150-200 bikes and the installation of 12-15 bikeshare stations around Suffolk County. The proposed bikeshare stations will vary in size but in general will have a minimal footprint and be located in non-environmentally sensitive areas. The proposed pilot program will include a smartphone app that will be made available to help facilitate short-term bike rental.

Mr. Carpenter made a motion to recommend classification of the proposed project as an Unlisted Action with a Negative Declaration. Ms. Growney seconded the motion. Motion carries.
